Update on Wheat Project

Thank you once again to all of you who came together to support the wheat project on the field in Kenya. This is a big step forward for the ministry.


The wheat was planted a few months ago. We have reports from the field that it is

doing well. The wheat is just getting ripe and will soon be ready to be harvested. As of now, they are estimating it will be ready around September or as late as October. With all that in place, we now face the challenge of preventing the birds from getting to the crop.

The total investment was

an estimated \$3000. We are expecting to sell the wheat for around \$5,000 yielding approximately \$2,000 as profit (liberal projection). The funds from the wheat project will be used to partially fund the Jehovah Jireh feeding program.

In this passage in Mark we read about Jesus and His disciples after a day of ministry. Verse 35 Deals with every day life. They were about to make a journey. In verse 37 a fierce storm arose. Circumstances can change in an instant. This is a part of life. Some are already comparing our

times to the Great Depression. Others are predicting a “perfect storm” of the financial crisis, the housing market and health care. Suddenly the disciples were in danger of perishing! In their despair, they forgot about the Hope that lay there in their midst. Everyone has doubts, everyone has questions. The disciples questioned if the Lord, if God, really cared about them and their situation. Scripture clearly teaches us to “cast our cares upon the Lord” (I Pet. 5:7).
