## 2009 Year End Review

- Over 45,000 meals were provided for children in Kaptembwo through the Jehovah Jireh Feeding Program.
- 5 High School students were sponsored for a calendar year of school through the OCM Scholarship Fund.
- OCM branched out and gave financial support in the amount of \$900 to the Mt Moriah Children's Home.
- 25 people prayed the prayer of Salvation and came to know the Lord through the efforts of the OCM churches in Kenya.
- The membership at Free Area Church increased. They are regularly congregating with 120-150 people each week.
- Kaptembwo Church has also seen an increase in attendance. They are averaging 80-100 churches on a weekly basis.
- Mwariki church is still growing! Every week 40-60 people join together to praise the Lord.
- Open Hands Christian Fellowship has added 4 new adults and three children to its membership! The church continues to grow!
- Free Area Fellowship has been able to continue conducting their annual married couples seminar.
- OCM continues to see more partners added each month. We currently have around 30 faithful partners. This year our partners have given just over \$22,000.

We are believing that in 2010 we will have more things to report as the ministry continues to see God's hand in all that it does!
